

Exodus 4 (verse by verse)

- Moses and his might:
 - In our Christian walk, we *never* rely on our own strength, wit, and human ingenuity.
 - God always reassures us, “Certainly I will be with you.”

- Moses and God’s Miracles:
 - In our Christian walk, God can use the common things (our talents, our tools, and available resources) to bring about supernatural outcomes for His glory.

- Moses and his Mouth:
 - Initially, God told Moses that God Himself would be Moses’ Mouth and instruct Moses what to say.
 - God’s anger burned against Moses.

“I will harden Pharaoh's heart.” *notes:*

- Moses missing the Mark:
 - Circumcision was an outward act, a sign of faith to keep a covenant with God.
 - Whenever God initiates a new movement He requires the people He uses to be completely yielded to His word.

- Colossians 2:11—When you came to Christ, you were “circumcised,” but not by a physical procedure. Christ performed a spiritual circumcision—the cutting away your sinful nature.

- Moved to Worship:

- Exodus 4:31—So the people believed; and when they heard that the LORD was concerned about the sons of Israel and that He had seen their affliction, they bowed down and worshipped.
