Exodus 4

(verse by verse)

- Moses and his might:
 - In our Christain walk, we *never* rely on our own strength, wit, and human ingenuity.
 - God always reassures us, <u>"Certainly I will be</u> with you."
- Moses and God's Miracles:
 - In our Christain walk, God can use the common things (our talents, our tools, and available resources) to bring about supernatural outcomes for His glory.
- Moses and his Mouth:
 - Initially, God told Moses that God Himself would be Moses' Mouth and instruct Moses what to say.
 - God's anger <u>burned against Moses</u>.

"I will harden Pharaoh's heart." notes:

- Moses missing the Mark:
 - Circumcision was an outward act, a <u>sign of faith</u> to keep a covenant with God.
 - Whenever God initiates <u>a new movement</u> He requires the people He uses to be completely <u>yielded to His word</u>.

■ Colossians 2:11–When you came to Christ, you were "circumcised," but not by a physical procedure. Christ performed a <u>spiritual circumcision</u>–the <u>cutting away your sinful nature</u>.

• Moved to Worship:

■ Exodus 4:31–So the people believed; and when they heard that the LORD was concerned about the sons of Israel and that He had seen their affliction, they bowed down and worshipped.
