- I. To Whom is Praise Expressed?
 - A. We praise the Lord exclusively!
 - B. God doesn't want <u>angels</u> worshiped, <u>saints</u> worshiped <u>preachers</u> worshiped, <u>worship</u> leaders worshiped and definitely not yourself.
 - C. "This is who <u>I am</u> to you", "This is what <u>I want from you"</u>, "This is what <u>I have done</u> for you", and "This is what I want from you".
- II. Where Does Praise Take Place?
 - A. Praise Him in His Sanctuary;
 - B. I would say anyplace, anytime.
 - C. where Gods people are gathered together and there are songs to be sung and a <u>Lord</u> who is alive to be praised, we engage in worship, we sing to Him.
- III. Why Should Praise Occur?
 - A. His mighty deeds; His excellent greatness.
 - B. you praise Him for "Who HE IS!"
 - C. Praise you are declaring a value.
- IV. How is Praise To Be Expressed?
 - A. Two ways, instruments that <u>man has made</u>, and with the instruments that <u>God has given.</u>
 - B. Music Is a part of our expressions and praise to the Lord, it's part of the art that forms around <u>praise</u>.
 - C. Praise will transform you; it will change you.
